EVANGELISM AND OUTREACH MINUTE FOR MISSIONS



An update from Mike and Nancy Mahon:
We are officially halfway through our current Home Ministry Assignment here in Ohio, so we thought

this might be a good time to share highlights from our last term. WE PRAISE GOD FOR HIS PROVISION and for ALL OF YOU for your prayers and financial support that made our

service possible in Peru this past term! (2019-2023)

ANOTHER TRANSLATION FINISHED!

For many years, a Wycliffe Bible Translator couple assigned to Peru had worked on the Ticuna language New Testament. Despite interruptions, this same couple (now in their 90s) finally saw the dedication of the Ticuna New Testament in a remote jungle village in northern Peru this past April. SAMAIR Peru played a vital part in this by transporting family members and dignitaries to and from the dedication.

"NEW" FLOATPLANE: Another highlight of our last term was watching God miraculously and rapidly provide a replacement for the SAMAIR PERU floatplane that was crushed in the windstorm of November 8, 2020! We dedicated to God's service the replacement in December of 2021.

ANKLE FUSION SURGERY: As some of you may know, the ankle I (Nancy) broke in 2016 had become very painful and was full of arthritis. We knew even while we were still in Peru that surgery would be needed ASAP once we were in Ohio. On September 28, I had ankle fusion surgery. An X-ray on November 7 showed enough healing that I could begin partial weight-bearing with a boot and crutches. I am very thankful for good care by a loving husband, your prayers, and meals brought in by folks from local churches. We are so very thankful for this surgery and an outstanding surgeon! This type of surgery is not available in Peru to my knowledge. I am now pain-free, praise the Lord!

SUPPORT NEEDS: During our visit to the SAM Home Office this past July, we looked at our current level of monthly support, which is at about 80% of the need. WE NEED TO MOVE CLOSER TO 100%. FAMILY: Several of you have asked to see a recent photo of our granddaughter Lucy, now six months old. She is a very pleasant and happy child who blessed all with her smiles and



joy. Daniel continues to work at Belen Brick. He is enjoying working with Hispanic and other coworkers.

Living for thirty-one years in a country where there are

fewer resources than in the U.S. causes us to reflect again on God's PERFECT TIMING. HE has ALWAYS provided for us and for SAMAIR Peru in such a way as to accomplish His will at HIS time and place in the remote jungles of eastern Peru. In the same way, when the "fullness of time" had come, He brought a Savior into the world to reconcile a broken and sinful world to Himself. His mercy continues to this day, "...not wishing that any should perish, but hat all should have eternal life." May this fact cause you to praise and wonder thanking Him for His goodness.

The Apostles' Creed was born from the apostles' teachings. It contains essential doctrines and beliefs that summarize the gospel and the foundation of our faith. The scriptural truths contained in the creed enable us to build our Christian lives on good theology, with the knowledge that our faith is rooted in truth and a rich history.

The lines of the creed aren't mere words. They are the essence of what we confess and believe. Repeating the creed doesn't make disciples. Incantations don't transform us into better, more effective Christians. Creeds don't hold any authority apart from Scripture, but they do point outside themselves to the authoritative Word of God.

The Apostles' Creed was traditionally used as a public confession before baptism. This confession of faith, given as a recitation of the creed, was understood as an act of turning away from previous pagan beliefs and fully accepting apostolic teaching. This profession identified new believers with the community of Christians.
