




theology, with the knowledge that our faith is rooted in truth and a rich history.

Culture is doing its best to convince the world there is nothing special about Jesus. And many Christians never get beyond a Sunday school understanding of their own faith. As a result, Christianity's most important historical fact—the resurrection—is often the most misunderstood, relegated to Easter and funeral services, creating a powerless Christianity.

The single most important fact of the Christian faith is that Jesus isn't dead. He was resurrected on a Sunday morning two thousand years ago. That one weekend included His execution, an earthquake, daytime darkness, an uprising, and a miracle



unlike any the world had ever seen.

Those events and the days that followed changed everything about the world and form the center of our faith. Yet outside of a few days each year, we don't spend a lot of time contemplating the resurrection itself.

In this four-session Bible study, we'll look back on that incredible weekend and see why the resurrection of Jesus gives us hope and confidence today.

The Session has authorized me to submit a property report to the FPC newsletter each month to keep the congregation informed of the repairs and expenses of our church building.

- The end of January we discovered a leak in the bathroom sink in the 3rd floor nursery. Due to the fact that the pipes and hardware were in very poor condition, we replaced the pipes and sink. The cost of this was \$859.58.
- We paid Brian Jaccaud \$1040.00 for six applications of salt on the parking lot and alley for the month of January.
- We bought paint to cover areas where we had mold previously treated. The cost for this was \$137.76.
- The toilet seat in the upstairs women's restroom was replaced at a cost of \$26.99.
- The fellowship hall will be professionally cleaned and the floors buffed for the memorial service for Ann Howard.
- We are in the process of converting the "Quilt Room" into a Sunday school classroom. It needs some rehab on the walls and floor.
- Some other areas of flooring will be stripped and waxed.
