

One Great Hour of Sharing Offering

As we turn our calendar to February and look down the page, Ash Wednesday appears and reminds us that the season of Lent will soon begin. Lent is a season of preparation to celebrate Easter. It is a season of fasting, prayer and sacrificial giving as we commemorate all that Jesus, our Savior and Lord suffered that we might be forgiven and spend eternity with Him.

As the church has been doing for more than seventy years, the Session has once again approved the receiving of the One Great Hour of Sharing offering from Ash Wednesday, February 22, 2023 **through Palm Sunday, April 2, 2023**. The offering will be equally divided between our local Salvation Army and World Vision. The total was \$1077.16 given in 2022.

World Vision, an international evangelical organization was founded in 1950. Their purpose is to help vulnerable children and their communities overcome poverty and experience a full life. Inspired by Christian beliefs, children of all backgrounds are helped, even in the most dangerous of communities. World Vision seeks to promote human transformation, seek justice and bear the good news of the kingdom of God to children and their communities by working with the poor and oppressed. These are not short term fixes, and World Vision often works in communities for many years until the communities can be self-sufficient.

The mission of the Newark Salvation Army is to preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ and to meet human needs in His name without discrimination. It is an evangelical part of the universal Christian church, and its message is based on the Bible.

The Salvation Army provides a multitude of services to alleviate poverty in our community. Those services include: food giveaways, emergency assistance to prevent homelessness, emergency shelter, emergency food pantry, soup kitchen, combating addiction, youth, young adult and senior programs, back to school and summer feeding programs and the Christmas cheer program. Need knows no season, and the

Salvation Army provides year round programs to help those with low income thrive. Of course, we need to remember that they are also a church and provide worship to the community.

Offering envelopes and coin banks will be available in the sanctuary. May you give generously to support these Christian charities.

Luke 24:1-8 On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, the women took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. ² They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, ³ but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. ⁴ While they were wondering about this, suddenly two men in clothes that gleamed like lightning stood beside them. ⁵ In their fright the women bowed down with their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? ⁶ He is not here; he has risen! Remember how he told you, while he was still with you in Galilee: ⁷ 'The Son of Man must be delivered over to the hands of sinners, be crucified and on the third day be raised again.' " ⁸ Then they remembered his words.
