Thank you all so much for taking the time to read the updates from our Mountain of Light in Honduras. The past few months have been marked by a lot of highs and a few lows, but our team has remained determined and hopeful that many good things are on the horizon.

On April 21, we hosted our annual Fiesta fundraising event. Thanks to your support, Fiesta 2023 raised over \$110,000 for MdL, making it one of our most successful fundraisers in MdL history! We are so grateful to everyone who contributed to its success and to the many volunteers who helped to organize everything.

The day after Fiesta, a fire made its way to MDL from the community below. Our incredible staff was able to get all of our kids and dogs safely off the mountain, while community members worked to put the fire out. Because firefighters never arrived, those who rushed to help us are true heroes to us. The fire caused a lot of damage at our facility; we were without water and electricity for nearly two weeks. It's safe to say we felt incredibly blessed that our biggest fundraiser of the year was the night before, as the money raised from Fiesta went immediately to help our clean-up process.

It is great to let our kids experience missions at an early age! Great job Evan!




Here's a hard working little packer.
