The Lord's Prayer



Adult Bible Class reconvenes on Sunday, September 7 at 9:15. We will be studying Deborah: Unlikely Heroes and the Book of Judges with Sandra L Richter, Phd.

The Book of Judges narrates one of the most chaotic and morally dark eras of Israel's story.
