

FINANCE REPORT

As of Wednesday, February 19, 2025, the checking account balance is \$19,080.92. This includes \$6,700.00 designated for capital improvements that has not yet been moved to the savings account.

The SCRIP account balance is: \$1,908.99.

The Savings account has a balance of \$9,601.23. This includes \$8,100 designated for upcoming major building repairs.

The line of credit balance (what we owe) is zero. Note that the line of credit has been an unsecured loan. PNB is eliminating their unsecured loans so our line of credit has now been closed.

LENTEN OFFERING:

FROM THE EVANGELISM AND OUTREACH COMMITTEE

As a part of the reformed faith, our church celebrates the seasons of the liturgical calendar. As we turn to the month of March, the Lenten season appears. Lent is likely the most important season of the whole liturgical year as we commemorate the passion and death of Jesus and is a season of prayer, fasting and the giving of extra time, talent and financial resources.

As our church has done for at least 75 years, the Session has approved the receiving of a Lenten offering. This offering has been referred to as the One Great Hour of Sharing offering, which is somewhat misleading since we have not given our offering through the PCUSA for many years. We have chosen to give half of the offering to the local Salvation Army and the other half to another appropriate international organization, World Vision. In order to be clear on the destination of these funds, the offering will now be designated as the Lenten Offering.

World Vision International is a Christian humanitarian organization dedicated to working with children, families and communities, regardless of race, ethnicity, religion, or gender, to reach their full potential by tracking the causes of poverty and injustice. World Vision serves the poor and oppressed as a demonstration of God's unconditional love for all people. They provide access to sustainable clean water, food, healthcare, safe living space and education as part of their care to children around the world. They also assist with disaster survivors and refugees around the world.

Newark Salvation Army is an evangelical part of the Christian church. Its message is based on the Bible. Its mission is to preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ and to meet human needs in His name without discrimination. The Corps in Newark and Licking county is focused on alleviating poverty. The center provides meals each day through a soup kitchen, a choice food pantry, community dinners and summer feeding programs for children. Other programs include programs for the homeless, adult education, job service programs, senior and elderly assistance, programs for teens and children, clothing distribution and worship services.

Envelopes for this special offering will be available at the doors of the sanctuary starting Ash Wednesday, March 5 through Palm Sunday, April 13, 2025. The offering will be dedicated on Palm Sunday. The church received \$910.39 for this offering in 2024.

And God is able to make it up to you by giving you everything you need and more, so that there will not only be enough for your own needs, but plenty left over to give joyfully to others. Millions of people around the world give up something during

Lent as a sign of sacrifice and to test their selfdiscipline.

Christians believe that this is to represent Jesus Christ's sacrifice when he went into the desert to pray and fast for the 40 days before dying on the cross.

In the New Testament, while Jesus was in the desert, Satan tempted him to turn away from God and worship him instead. Jesus refused and resisted temptation, which is why people might choose to sacrifice something during Lent. In this way, we can learn to be more like Christ and practice the fruit of self-control.






Can you believe we are already to spring??? Time is a constant reminder to me that although the seasons (and seasons of our lives) change continually, God never does. Who He is today is the same as He has
