

Adult Bible Class is studying <u>Deborah: Unlikely</u> <u>Heroes and the Book of Judges</u> with Sandra L Richter, Ph.D.

The Book of Judges narrates one of the most chaotic and morally dark eras of Israel's story. Into this morally-ambiguous time comes one of

the most unlikely leaders of the biblical text—the prophet Deborah. Also a wife, mother, priest, and judge, Deborah responds to her call and transforms chaos into order by leading Israel in one of the most pivotal victories of her time.


- 1. What territory can you see from where you are standing that belongs to the Kingdom of God but is not in the hands of God's people?
